Those who wish to apply for grants must meet the following criteria:

- Grant must be written by youth no older than eighteen
- Project location must be within Saline County
- Application must be completed in full and postmarked by March 8<sup>th</sup>
- A plan of how the funds will be used and how they will better the community must be provided
- A follow-up report must be submitted if awarded a grant

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# Top 10 Ways to Write a Successful Grant:

1. Be detailed, but not wordy
2. Tell us what you honestly plan to buy
3. Be open to taking less than your minimum
4. Your timeline may be written as a few sentences or as a list
5. Try to pick a project that helps as many youth as possible
6. Don't be afraid to admit that your project may not be completed without our help
7. Remember that YGMC is unable to fund trips, debt repayments, and scholarships
9. Review your application for errors once you have completed it
